GENERAL RULES:

1. All 4-H members with clothing projects are eligible but not required to compete in the Style Revue contest. To receive any clothing awards and premiums, members must be present at county clothing judging and model in the correct category at the Style Revue.
2. If an exhibitor does not participate in the county clothing judging, the child may model in the correct modeling contest, but will not be eligible for any modeling or project awards.
3. Once a 4-H'er has taken project 406, 408, 411, 412, 415, 417, 418, 420, 424, 425, 426, she/he may not go back and take projects 407, 409, 410, 413, or 419.
4. During the style revue, clothing winners will be announced at the end of each class. Modeling winners will be announced at the end of the modeling contests.
5. Guidelines for Placing in Clothing Projects - Older members aren't eligible to win in categories that are limited to younger members. But younger members may compete in project categories designed for older members (although it's not generally encouraged and they have to meet all the same requirements as the older competitors).
6. All items that constitute an outfit should be wearable at the same time. A carry on garment (for example, extra pair of slacks) is not acceptable. This does not apply to accessories. No additional stand alone props may be used during judging or the style review.
7. Multiple Projects - 4-H members who take more than one clothing project must complete separate learning experiences related to each, including creating a separate, complete total-look outfit for each clothing project.
8. Repeating Projects – Members who repeat projects should attempt new challenges each year such as doing more advanced experiments and surveys and sewing more complicated patterns or harder-to-handle fabrics.
9. Each class will be placed 1 – 5.
10. The Style Revue will feature the following projects: Sundresses and Jumpers, Clothing for Middle School, Clothes for High School and College, Loungewear, Ready, Set, Sew Active, Dress-Up Outfit, Outerwear for Anywhere, Terrific Tops, Sew for Others, Designed By Me, Shopping Savvy, Creative Costumes, Accessories for Teens, Clothing for Your Career, Sew Fun!, Look Great For Less and em-bel-lish.
11. No entries are required for this department. Final judging schedule will be mailed in July.
12. 4-H members must complete the project requirements as outlined in the 4-H Advisors and Members Project Guide.
13. To receive premium money, the actual project must be judged during the judging day, member must model in style review and project must exhibited in club booth. Clothing project premiums will be paid at the style review.

14. Projects judged in this department must have been completed specifically for the project enrolled. Items made for school projects or other youth participation may not be evaluated as a 4-H project.

15. **Required for judging:** bring your pattern (or instructions), a 2"x2" sample of your fabric and a 4"x6" photo (digital or print) of member in your project to attach to your judging sheet.

16. Members must model in the items made for their current project for the entire Style Review, the only exception is members enrolled in Sew for Others.

Classes

- 406** Clothes for High School & College - construct a school outfit (at least 2 pieces or one garment with sleeves), project book and records
- 407** Accessories for Teens - construct at least one from this list: bag/purse, belt, cummerbund, footwear/shoe covers, hat, gloves, jewelry, removable collar/dickey/jabot, scarf/tie, muffler/shawl, socks/hosiery, or suspenders; project book and records. Wear the accessory with the outfit for which it was designed.
- 408** Creative Costumes - plan, make, and accessorize your costume, project book and records
- 409** Sew Fun! – constructed item of clothing - fully elastic-waist skirt, shorts, pants or capris, project book and activity records
- 410** Designed By Me - T-shirt, sweatshirt, button down shirt or a simple jacket, add at least two embellishments, project book and records
- 411** em-bel-lish: A 4-H Guide to wearable art - completed project book and activity records, item of clothing you have embellished.
- 412** Sew for Others - outfit constructed or 3 garments altered, project book and records
- 413** Sundresses and Jumpers - sew sundress or jumper, project book and records. No jumpsuits, pantsuits, skorts, split skirt jumpers, etc.
- 415** Ready, Set, Sew Active - assemble and construct active sportswear outfit (construct at least one garment), project book and records
- 417** Dress-Up Outfit - construct an outfit for dressy occasions, project book and records
- a) day wear
 - b) formal wear
- 418** Loungewear - assemble lounging outfit, constructing at least the outer layer, project book and records
- 419** Terrific Tops - make a top, project book and records
- 420** Outerwear for Anywhere - make a coat, jacket, or cape; project book and records, practice garment
- 424** Clothing for Middle School - construct a school outfit (at least 2 pieces or one garment with sleeves), project book and records
- 425** Look Great For Less - completed book and records. For style revue, wear total look outfit you created.
- 426** Clothing for Your Career - construct an (minimum of 2 piece) outfit for a job interview, project records and completed book
- 430** Shopping Savvy – put together an outfit including accessories, completed book and records

Premiums and Awards:

A - \$4.00 B - \$3.00 C - \$2.00

Best Wool Outfit - the best outfit sewn with fabric containing 70% or more wool.

Best Sewing with Pig Suede - 1, 2, and 3 places

Best Beef Leather or Suede Outfit

Clothing Achievement Awards (2) - To qualify for one of these awards, members must meet the following criteria: at least 6 years of 4-H work, enrolled in clothing project, and nominated by advisor. The awards are based on clothing record and may only be won once.

MODELING CONTEST:

There will be one modeling contest at the 4-H Style Revue. Categories are based on 4-H member's age as of January 1 of the current year. Modeling contestants will wear their 4-H outfits.

4-H members enrolled in 4-H Clothing Projects may enter the Modeling

Contest. Members must model in the items made for their current project for the entire Style Review, the only exception is members enrolled in Sew for Others.

If an exhibitor does not participate in the county clothing judging, the child may model in the correct modeling contest, but will not be eligible for any modeling or clothing awards or premiums.

Winners of the modeling divisions will move up to the next modeling division the following year. Winners may win in only one division per year. Winners of the Beginners, Junior, and Intermediate divisions may only win each division once. Members modeling in the senior division may win more than one year in this division only.

Winners will be announced at the conclusion of all modeling contests.

Beginner division - ages 8 to 10
Junior division - ages 11 to 12
Intermediate division - ages 13 to 15
Senior division – ages 16 and over
