# BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

## BLACK SWAMP COUNCIL

# GIRL SCOUTS OF AMERICA

Girl Scouting is a program that gives girls from all segments of American life a chance to develop their potential to make friends and to become a vital part of their community. Based on ethical values, it opens up a world of opportunity for youth, working in partnership with adult volunteers.

Girl Scouting is continuous adventure in learning that offers girls a broad range of activities which address both their current interests and their future roles as women. Through activities that stimulate self-discovery, they are introduced to the excitement in the worlds of science, the arts, the out-of-doors and people. Girls grow in skill and in self-confidence. They have fun, make friends and through meaningful community service, they acquire understanding about themselves and others.

Girl Scouting is one continuous program open to all girls 5 through 17, including Daisy Girl Scouts (ages 5-6), Brownie Girl Scouts (ages 6-8), Junior Girl Scouts (ages 8-11), Cadet Girl Scouts (ages 11-14), and Senior Girl Scouts (ages 14-17).

Today's troop program is carried on by over three million girls in over 192,000 troops, including USA Girl Scouts overseas in 60 countries where members come from U.S. Military and civilian families living abroad.

Girl Scouts of the U.S.A. is part of an international movement. It is linked with other Girl Scouts and Girl Guides through membership in over 112 countries around the world.

The Girl Scouts consider participation in the Auglaize County Fair a privilege and an opportunity to share their accomplishments, interests, and ideals. All exhibits must show high quality in effort, originality, neatness, and Girl Scout Program.

Every registered Girl Scout troop in Auglaize County is eligible to enter. All exhibits must be made by the troops expressly for the Girl Scout program. Fair exhibits should be an outgrowth of good Girl Scout programming either in troop meetings, troop camping, or Day Camp.

- 7 The Auglaize County Fair Board will not be responsible for lost or stolen items, or damage to items placed on exhibit. However, every precaution will be taken by the Fair board to protect the school exhibits.

(Exhibitor must have a list of ingredients taped to bottle)

B No commercial wines or dilutions with commercial wines.

C Containers must be of glass and shall be approximately 1/5 US gallons or about twenty-six ounces.

Containers will have wine corks or screw caps and variety labeled container.

D Wines may have been made any year or blended from any combination of years;

However any container of wine that wins a premium must be permanently disqualified from future exhibition and judging again.

E Wines shall be judged on color, clarity, bouquet, taste, complexity, body, balance, intensity, and finish.

F Each exhibitor is allowed only one entry per lot with the exception of any not listed classes where two entries of different varieties will be allowed.

G Any Exhibitor wishing to take home wine after show after judging must bring a bottle to replace the enter one for display.
