

BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

Scouting for boys was begun by Sir Robert Baden Powell of England in 1908 and has since spread throughout the World. In 1910, the Boy Scouts of America was founded to promote the ability of boys to do things for themselves and others, to train them in Scout craft and to teach them patriotism, courage, self-reliance and kindred virtues. Scouts wear a distinctive uniform and are led by adults and boy leaders. Badges are awarded for achievement and proficiency in various crafts and skills. Membership today is over 6,000,000 in the United States, including Cub Scouts aged 8 to 10, Boy Scouts ages 11-18, and Explorers, ages 16 and over.

The purpose of the Boy Scouts of America is character building, citizenship training, physical fitness, and belief in the ideals of Scouting. The program of Scouting is offered to and used by organizations for the youth of the community and organization.

Rules and Regulations

1. Any and all Cub Packs, Scout Troops and Explorer Posts may have a display.
2. The display must be identified by a unit flag and American flag, additional identification may be used.
3. The display should show an activity or subject or a combination of activities and subjects.
4. **Set-up to be finished up before Saturday morning August 1, 2020**
5. Displays can be removed on **Sunday, August 9, 2020 after 9:00 A.M.**
6. The building will be locked at 10:00 p.m. every night of the fair.

Premiums

All units having a representative display approved by the Scouting Committee will receive \$40.00 as a contribution to their efforts.

All entries must be made to: Lawrence A. Kill, by July 8, 2020, preceding the fair. 1st, 2nd, 3rd place ribbons for best display.

GIRL SCOUTS OF AMERICA

Girl Scouting is a program that gives girls from all segments of American life a chance to develop their potential to make friends and to become a vital part of their community. Based on ethical values, it opens up a world of opportunity for youth, working in partnership with adult volunteers.

Girl Scouting is continuous adventure in learning that offers girls a broad range of activities which address both their current interests and their future roles as women. Through activities that stimulate self-discovery, they are introduced to the excitement in the worlds of science, the arts, the out-of-doors and people. Girls grow in skill and in self-confidence. They

have fun, make friends and through meaningful community service, they acquire understanding about themselves and others.

Girl Scouting is one continuous program open to all girls 5 through 17, including Daisy Girl Scouts (ages 5-6), Brownie Girl Scouts (ages 6-8), Junior Girl Scouts (ages 8-11), Cadet Girl Scouts (ages 11-14), and Senior Girl Scouts (ages 14-17).

Today's troop program is carried on by over three million girls in over 192,000 troops, including USA Girl Scouts overseas in 60 countries where members come from U.S. Military and civilian families living abroad.

Girl Scouts of the U.S.A. is part of an international movement. It is linked with other Girl Scouts and Girl Guides through membership in over 112 countries around the world.

The Girl Scouts consider participation in the Auglaize County Fair a privilege and an opportunity to share their accomplishments, interests, and ideals. All exhibits must show high quality in effort, originality, neatness, and Girl Scout Program.

Every registered Girl Scout troop in Auglaize County is eligible to enter. All exhibits must be made by the troops expressly for the Girl Scout program. Fair exhibits should be an outgrowth of good Girl Scout programming either in troop meetings, troop camping, or Day Camp.

All exhibits will be under the supervision of competent persons at all times and every effort will be made to protect them from loss or injury. However, neither the management of the Auglaize County Fair nor the Girl Scouts will be responsible for any loss or injury to exhibits.

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All entries must be made to: Lawrence A. Kill, by July 8, 2020 preceding the fair.
